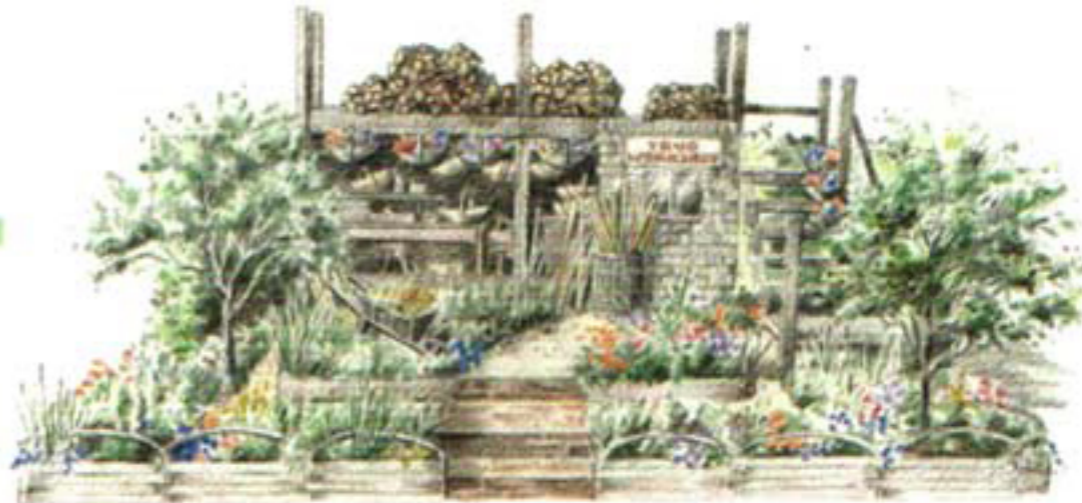


A TRUGMAKER'S GARDEN BY FUTURE CLIMATE INFO

What process did you go through to win the project?

The idea of a trugmaker's garden developed quickly when we began thinking of crafts traditional to our area of East Sussex and Kent, and we were drawn to the ageless simplicity of trugs.

How did you choose your contractor?

Walking through the RHS Chelsea 2014 exhibition I overheard someone say 'if I was ever going

to do an Artisan Chelsea garden I would get Frogheath Landscapes as my contractor'. That snippet of conversation stuck in my mind. I did some research and realised they were 30 minutes down the road from where I lived. On meeting with Frogheath they suggested I team up with their freelance designer, Tina Vallis.

Which nursery is supplying the plants for your garden?

Hardy's Cottage Garden Plants and Chichester Trees and Shrubs.

What will happen to your garden after the show?

The plants are being donated to Demelza, a children's hospice in the Weald.

How many times have you been involved with Chelsea?

Last year's garden at Chelsea was our first show garden, so it was a baptism of fire for the Frogheath team, but the experience was fantastic and

made all the better with an award of a Gold medal.

How many people will be on your team during the build?

Seven, with more skilled craftsmen at different stages of the build.
